2. Okay, that's great, but is there a direct way of getting to the formal documentation?

There sure is! That would be our official notice board. You can find that here!

3. How would I know which courses I am sailing? Or how can my friends and family stay in the loop?

We got dedicated WhatsApp Groups set up for both racing courses, every day the courses will be announced as well as any other relevant racing information. Great for you as the participant, but also for your friends ashore! Courses are decided on the night before the race day, and of course we are hoping to **race Around the Island on Friday**, if the weather allows us! The RC will also be emailing all competitors with the course decision each day and this will be posted on the electronic Notice board.

- Fill out the hearing request form completely.
- Select "continue and file this protest"
- On the mobile site check in RC Dock / Race Protests for your protest.

You can also still lodge a paper protest at the protest desk within the protest time limit. The Committee and Protest Desk can be found on the Terrace by Port de Plaisance on all days.









# 5. What are these bow numbers you gave me and what do I do with them after the racing? And how about the class flag?

The race committee will make identification numbers available at Registration for boats that do not have sail numbers. Only participating boats without sail numbers will be required to have bow and stern numbers.

It is the obligation of the participant to ensure that they are visible especially during the start and finish!!



The identification numbers will be "tie-on" guardrail

banners. Please be aware that a deposit of US\$100 or €100 is required- for the bow and stern numbers handed to you at registration. This deposit will be refunded when handing the bow and stern numbers back on Sunday at PDP from 2pm -6pm or Monday at the SMYC from 9am – 3pm.

**Class flags** are collected at registration, we kindly ask you to support our sustainability efforts and return these with your bow numbers, or in the allocated bin at the SMYC.

### 6. What are the bridge openings during the Regatta?

We got 2 special bridge openings for participants of the Regatta only: **a 9am outbound** in case you ran late for the 8.30am bridge **and a 2pm inbound** in case your excellent racing skills give you a finish time ahead of everyone else.

- 8. Complete an incident report

The Coast Guard is concerned with safety and will actively pursue the following issues

• **Dinghy Capacity:** The Coast Guard will prosecute dinghies where the number of persons on board exceeds the manufacturers' specification. If your dinghy has a specification for four persons there should only be up to four persons on board. The number of persons is usually on the plate of the transom.

Gendarmerie

- **Speed**: Whilst there is no defined speed limit, your speed should be such to be safe and not cause the threat of danger or disturbance from a wake due to your speed. In the bridge channel and in locations where visibility is restricted that is a low speed that is certainly no more than 5 mph.
- **Lights:** When driving your dinghy at night you must have a proper flashlight with you as required by the Island Legislation. It must of course be functional.

# 8. What should I know to make sure we don't break any rules regarding sustainability and the environment?

### 9. Our crew gets hungry and thirsty easily, what F&B options are there?

When you return to the Regatta Village you have several bars to rehydrate and a food court to fill up on delicious local food and of course St. Maarten is well known for its wide array of restaurants offering a

# 10. I would love to race, but don't own a boat and haven't found one to race on yet, any suggestions?

You can spot the judging area by their sign which will be on the deck of the Sint Maarten Yacht Club. They will be judging on: Originality, Effort and Crowd Reaction

The judges will be taking into consideration the reaction from the crowd on the deck and will score the boats with cards from 1 to 5 which they will hold up for you to see. The winners will be crowned at the prize giving on Sunday March 3.

For all those sailors and non-sailors who come to St. Maarten not only to sail but also to party, we have a serious challenge. By water for all:

Thursday – Sat: 4pm – 8pm between SMYC and Port de Plaisance
Sun: 4pm – 10pm between SMYC and Port de Plaisance
This is a paid service open to all as a fundraiser for the Youth Sailing Program of the SMYC at \$5pp per trip.

### 14. Is there a token system in place again?

No not this year, we are going for a cashless system using the Kband app, not a fan of apps? You can buy a card **that is easily topped up with cash or card**. It's a known system on the island and allows us to be more sustainable! No more plastic tokens!

The Reserve Naturelle Nationale de Saint-Martin and the Agoa Sanctuary for marine mammals would like to draw your attention on the **high risk of collisions between vessels and large whales** during sailing races, both for participating and supports vessels.

Indeed, competitors are likely to encounter several species of marine mammals present in the Agoa Sanctuary, including:

- humpback whales, spending their breeding season (December-May) in Caribbean waters to breed, give birth and nurse their calves. They are regularly seen close to shore;
- resident delphinids (dolphins, pilot whales), particularly the bottlenose dolphin, a relatively coastal species, and spotted dolphins (pantropical and Atlantic species).

To a lesser extent, competitors may encounter other delphinid species (Clymene dolphin, rough-toothed dolphin) or deep-diving species (beaked whale, dwarf sperm whale, sperm whale).

The risk of collision is a serious concern. The Agoa Sanctuary shares with you some key recommendations. The goal is to minimize the risk of collisions to preserve the integrity of crews and their vessels and reduce disturbance to these species protected by law, in particular within a sanctuary dedicated to their peacefulness.

**Maintain visual watch at all times**. Whales are air-breathing mammals that must surface to get the air they need. At sea, marine mammal can be spotted by their blows – exhalation of air through the blowholes that looks like small cloud of water and air from 1 to 2 m high.

In case of a last-minute encounter with a large marine mammal, reduce your speed and sail away from the animal, or the group of animals, preferably bypassing it from the rear.

Pursuing animals is strictly forbidden.

Do not interact with cetaceans.

In the event of **cetaceans voluntarily approaching under 300m** of the vessel, **reduce your speed** and alter course only if there is a risk of collision.

We invite all following vessels to moderate their speed. In addition to the necessity of complying to speed regulations, **speed is an aggravating factor in collisions**, both for mariners and marine mammals.

Marine mammals are protected by a decree of July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 which lists marine mammals that are protected on the national territory and the terms of their protection. It also prohibits the prosecution and harassment of animals. The local decree n°R-2017-03-15-

003 from March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017 regulates the approach of cetaceans in water under French jurisdiction in the West Indies and prohibits the approach of marine mammals closer than 300m in all French West Indies. We remind you that failure to comply with these rules constitutes an infraction punishable by up to three years of imprisonment and 150,000€ fine.



During the race, any disturbance of cetaceans in the French Exclusive Economic Zone must be immediately reported to the Agoa Sanctuary (+596 696 33 19 15) and to the MRCC (phone 196 / VHF 16).

If you witness entanglements, strandings or marine mammals in distress, immediately notify the local person in charge of the National Stranding Network:

In order to improve knowledge of marine mammals, the organizer is requested to forward all marine mammal observation data collected during the race to the following addresses: <u>sanctuaire.agoa@ofb.gouv.fr</u> (+596 696 38 45 38). This information should include date, GPS location and species identification. It can then be used for future studies.

We are at your disposal for any further information you may require.
